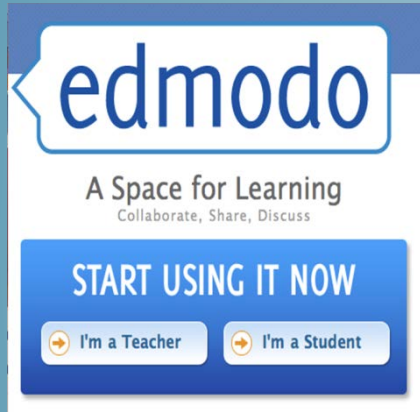
Before We Begin

This entire presentation will be made available to you for future reference via our school website, so you do not need to take extensive notes.

It is helpful, but not necessary to have at least one of the following:

- Your child's username and password for Edmodo. This is their Gmail address and password. You may wish to text them now if you do not have this.
- Your child's iPad.

Daily Use: The Big Three of the iPad



Edmodo:
Where assignments are found and announcements are made.

Notability:
Where (most) assignments are completed.

eBackpack:
Where many assignments are graded.

Where do I look for my child's grades?



Parent Portal provides access to your child's grades and progress reports, whether they were graded digitally on eBackpack or manually in the classroom. Every parent or guardian should have a Parent Portal login and password. If you do not an arrangement can be made by contacting our main office tomorrow.

Parent portal generally closes for a week at the end of a quarter

Edmodo: First Things First

Edmodo can be accessed in two ways:


1. **Through the iPad app.** This is a terrible way to do things. Students are encouraged to go through the Chrome or Safari apps. They often do not listen to this encouragement, because it is quicker to go on the app, which can be glitchy.
2. **Through ANY web browser on ANY device.** A student or parent can access Edmodo via any web browsers, such as Internet Explorer, Mozilla, Safari, or Chrome, and any device, including a personal computer at home, laptops, MacBooks, iPad, iPhones, and Samsung phones. This is far, far, far more reliable for the students and parents than accessing the website via the app.


In short:

App = Bad, and somewhat glitchy.

Web site = Excellent.

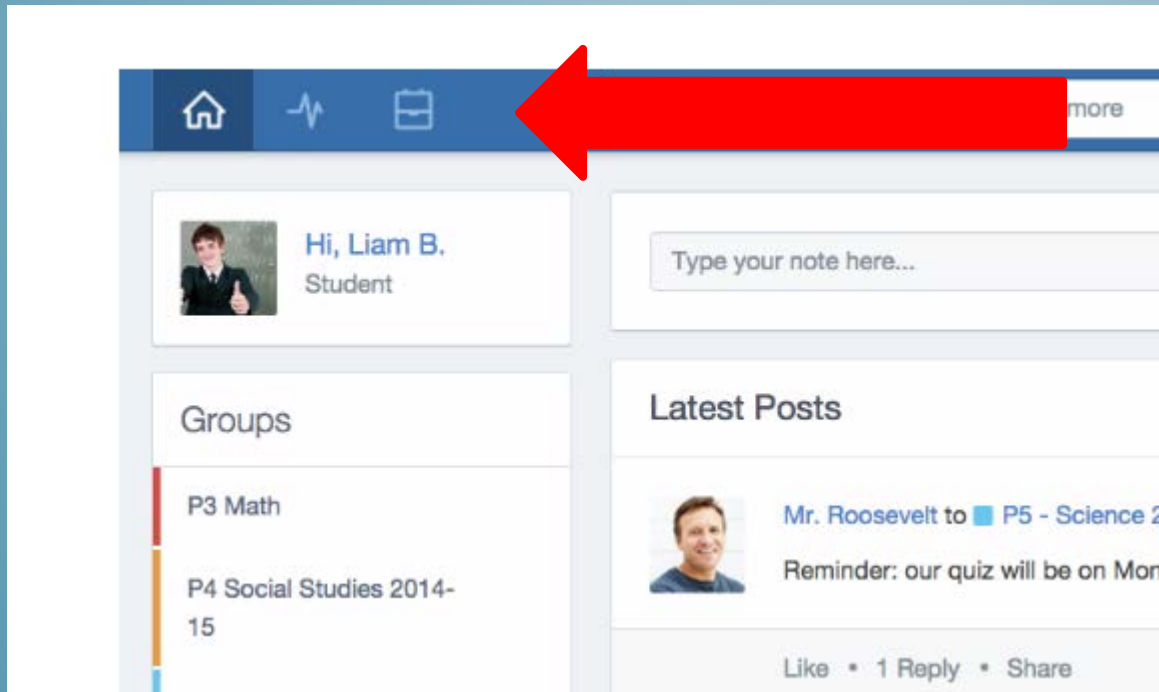

Each class has its own **Edmodo group**. Every day the teacher will post a **Note**, which has files attached that the students will need, an announcement regarding homework, as well as lesson instructions or goals for the day. Students are encouraged to reply to the day's note with any questions they have about that days assignment.

Edmodo: Accessing the Planner

The planner might be the most useful tool on the iPad, and it can only be accessed via Edmodo's web page. In other words, **not through the Edmodo app**.

Click the little backpack at the top left of the screen to bring you to the page that gives you access to the planner.

Edmodo: The Planner in Action

From the planner you can see all of your child's assignments in every one of their classes. Each classes can even be color coded for better viewing. *It can only be accessed via Edmodo's web page, not through the Edmodo app.*

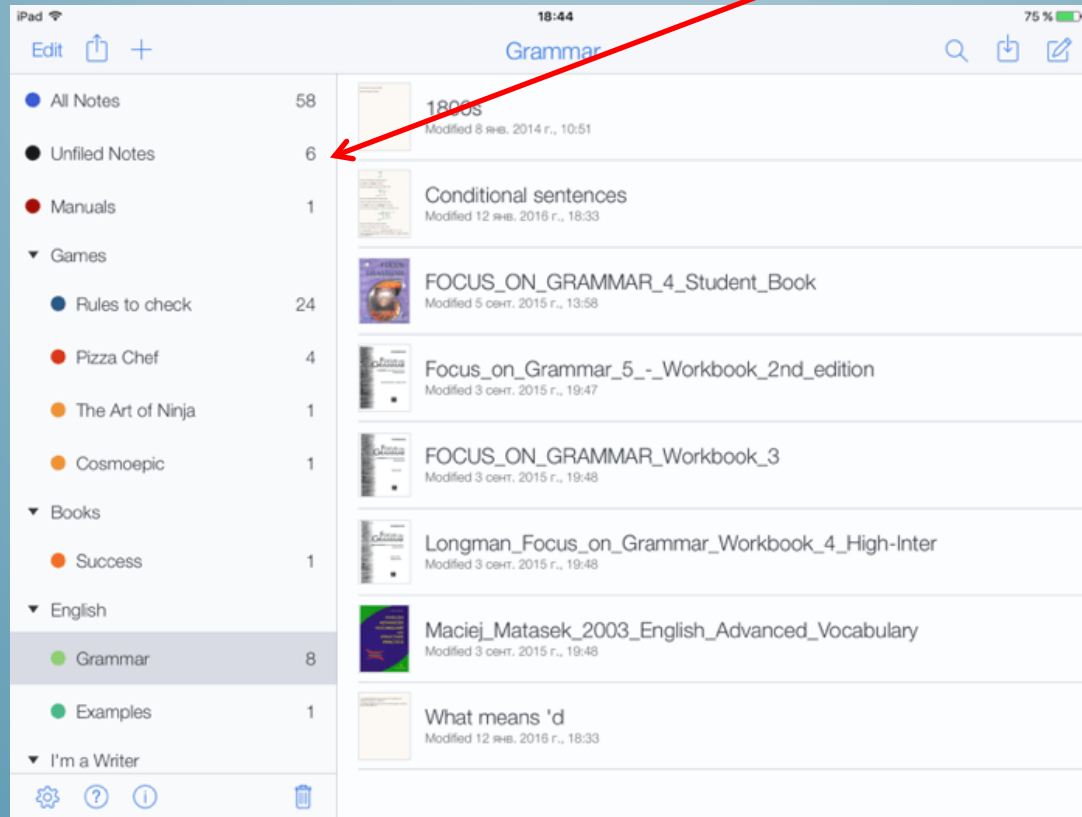

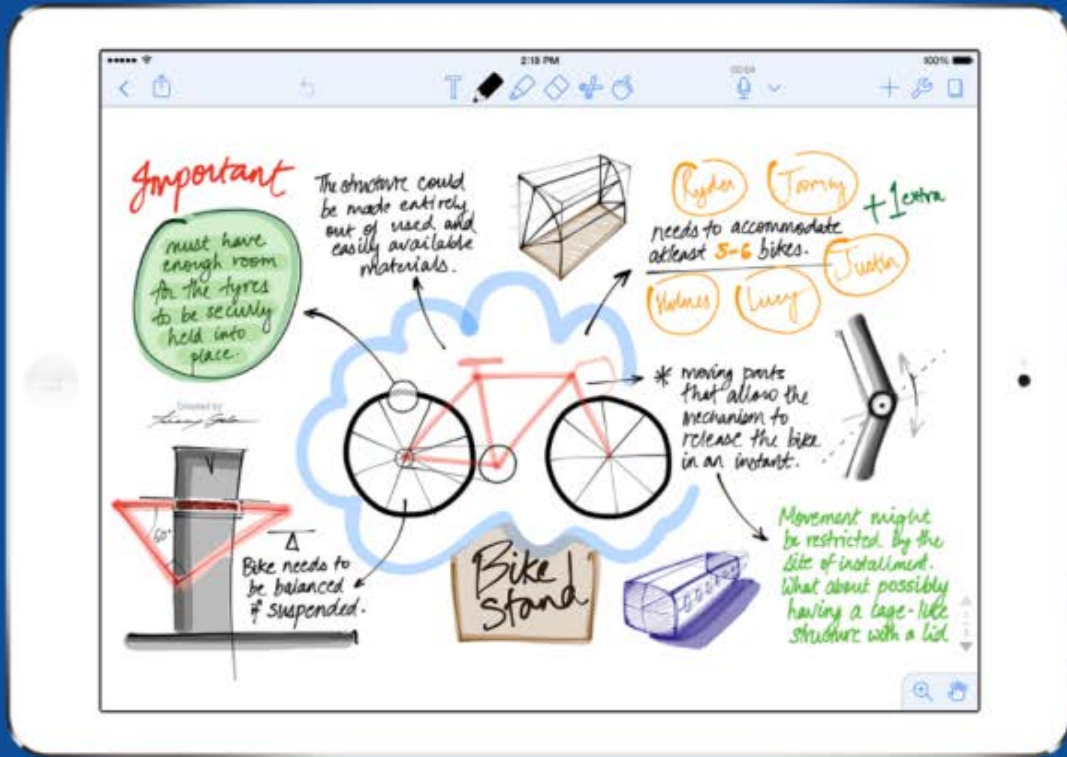


Notability: Your Child's Binder

Your child's work will often be download from Edmodo into **Notability**, which is the digital version of a binder. Notability has been divided into subjects for each class, and then categories for each subject. It is important that your child files their work into the different categories so it can be easily found. **Check for unfiled notes.** If you see them, that's bad, but easily fixed.



Notability: Your Child's Binder




Combine handwriting, photos and typing to bring your projects to life.

Add as much detail as you like with a variety of colors and fonts.

In **Notability** your child can draw, type, and organize graphics in other ways that helps them complete assignments. Students are encouraged to type, rather than “hand write” their answers. They are also encouraged to get USB keyboards, which help them work quicker, see more of the screen, and develop useful typing skills.

eBackPack: Work is Submitted and Graded

In eBackPack assignments are submitted for grading. While not everything is graded this way, a significant enough piece of assignments are. Ultimately everything ends up on Parent Portal, but assignments graded on eBackpack often have helpful teacher feedback for the students.

Redefining the Landscape of Education

Students are now assessed along both traditional educational models as well as through creative avenues made possible through the iPad.

The classroom experience is shaped so differently that students often become the teachers. Through the flipped classroom model students examine concepts across subjects and then teach their classmates through presentation tools such as Keynote, EdPuzzle, Zaption, or Prezi, taking greater ownership over the material.



1 MAKE CONTENT (iPad Camera)

1. Make a Film or Animation
(Anything that puts a video into your camera roll)
2. Play and Pause video
3. Drag play marker to first frame for poster
4. Take Screenshot of first frame

2 MAKE TRIGGER POSTER (Pages)

5. Make poster in Pages to print out for the classroom wall that will trigger the video

3 STEP 3: MAKE AURA (Video Poster) (Aurasma)

6. Click Aurasma logo to start.
7. Click Device
8. Click + and select video from photo album
9. Select
10. Point camera at Poster - Green means unique enough
11. Take trigger shot
12. Resize video to match Photo
13. Name Aura, 14. Public
15. Add to channel (This might be a course or class name)
16. Finish & upload
17. To see the Auras, students can now search for and "Follow" the channel
